

CREATING YOUR HABITAT

To launch your your Texan by Nature monarch conservation project, complete these steps.

PLANT NATIVE MILKWEED OR MILKWEED SEEDS*

Milkweed is the only plant monarch butterflies lay eggs on.

PLANT POLLINATOR-FRIENDLY SPECIES*

CREATE A WATER SOURCE

This could be a birdbath, pond, fountain, or wetland.

PLEASE ALSO COMPLETE ONE OR MORE OF THESE ADDITIONAL OPTIONS:

*Eliminate use of chemical fertilizers and herbicides**

*Remove invasive plant species**

*Provide cover for monarchs with a rock pile, shrubs, or native prairie grasses**

Create puddling areas by filling a shallow container with water and mud/sand
